

✓✓ Unit 1A

1. **Partner** (noun): Someone who works with you

E.g.: Jack is my business partner.

2. **Airport** /

'erpɔ:rt//

(noun): a place where planes land and take off and that has buildings for passengers to wait in

E.g.: Mehrabad airport



3. **Museum** /mju: 'ziəm/ (noun): A building where important cultural, historical, or scientific objects are kept and shown to the public

E.g.: The Museum of Modern Art.



4. **Gate** /geɪt/ (noun): The part of a fence or outside wall that you can open and close then you can enter or leave a place

E.g.: Make sure that the back gate is locked.

5. **Complete** /kəm'pli:t/ (verb): Having all of the necessary parts; whole.

E.g.: Please complete your information.

6. **Remember** /rɪ'membər/ (verb): To have a picture or idea in your mind of people, events, places etc. from the past. **OPP** Forget

E.g.: Do you remember Rosa Davies?

7. **Boarding** /'bo:rdɪŋ/ (noun): The act of going into a ship, air plane etc. to travel somewhere

E.g.: Ladies and gentlemen, boarding will start in just a few minutes.

- Country** /'kʌntri/ (noun): A large area of land where people live under the same government or have the same culture
E.g.: China is a country in Asia.
- Nationality** /næʃə'næləti/ (noun): People living in the same part of the world and having the same history, language, and culture.
E.g.: My nationality is Iranian.
- Continent** /'kə:ntmənt/ (noun): one of the six or seven great divisions of land on the globe
E.g.: the continent of Europe
- Useful** /'ju:sfəl/ (adjective): To be used in a helpful, practical way.
E.g.: Useful information
- Capital** /'kæpətl/ (noun): An important city where the main government of a country, state, etc. is.
E.g.: Tehran is the capital of Iran.
- Flag** /flæg/ (noun): A piece of cloth with a colored pattern or picture on it that shows a country or organization
E.g.: The flag of Sweden.
- Chess** /tʃes/ (noun): A board game played by two people in which each player has sixteen pieces, and the object is to trap the opponent's king.



- Interview** /'intərvju:/ (noun): A meeting that someone is asked questions to find whether they are suitable for a job, course of study, etc.
E.g.: I had a job interview with a manager.

- Vacation** /və'keɪʃən/ (noun): A holiday or time spent not working
E.g.: He's on vacation this week.

✓✓ Unit 1B – Listening

- Departing** /dɪ'pa:t/ (verb): to go away or leave, especially on a journey:
E.g.: The plane departs at 6 a.m.
- Flight** /flaɪt/ (noun): a journey in an aircraft:
E.g.: I'll never forget my first flight.
- Passenger** /'pæsɪndʒər/ (noun): A person who is not driving, but travels in an automobile, bus, train.
E.g.: The plane has over 500 passengers.

- Immediately** /ɪ'mi:diətlɪ/ (adverb): Without delay
E.g.: He answered the phone immediately.

- Slice** /slais/ (noun): a flat, often thin, piece of food that has been cut from a larger piece:
E.g.: a slice of bread/cake



✓✓ Unit 1C

1. **Classroom** /'klæsruːm/ (noun): A room in a school or college where classes are held
E.g.: Classroom activities.

2. **Personal** /'pərsonəl/ (adjective): Belonging or relating to one particular person, rather than to other people or to people in general
E.g.: Please write your personal information

3. **Portable** /pɔːrəbəl/ (adjective): Able to be carried or moved easily
E.g.: A portable radio.

4. **First name** (noun): The name that comes first in someone's full name
E.g.: My first name is Sara.

5. **Age** /'eɪdʒ/ (noun): The amount of time during which a person or animal has lived
E.g.: What is your age? (=how old are you?)


6. **Address** /ə'dres/ (noun): The words and numbers that are used to show the location of a building
E.g.: Write your name, address, and phone number for me.

7. **Zip code** (noun): A group of numbers that is used in the U.S. as part of an address to show a mail delivery area (such as a town or a part of a city) **SYN** postcode
E.g.: The records will be in order by zip code.

8. **Spell** /spel/ (verb): To form a word by writing or naming the letters in order
E.g.: How do you spell 'book'? B-O-O-K

9. **Important** /ɪm'pɔː.tənt/ (adjective): necessary or of great value:
E.g.: It's important for children to learn to get on with each other.

10. **Information** /ɪn.fə'meɪʃən/ (noun): facts about a situation, person, event, etc.:
E.g.: Do you have any information about/on train times?

11. **Landline** /'lænd.laɪn/ (noun): a phone that is connected to the phone system by wires



✓✓ Practical 1

- 1. Reception** /rɪ'sepʃən/ (noun): the place in a hotel or office building where people go when they first arrive:
E.g.: The reception of Hilton Hotel.
- 2. Elevator** /'eləveɪtər/ (noun): A machine that takes people and goods from one level to another in a building **SYN Lift**
E.g.: We have to take the elevator.
- 3. Assistant** /ə'sɪstənt/ (noun): Someone who helps someone else in their work, especially by doing the less important jobs
E.g.: A dentist has an assistant who helps him.
- 4. Vacation** /və'keɪʃən/ (noun): A holiday or time spent not working
E.g.: He's on vacation this week.
- 5. Sign** /saɪn/ (noun): A piece of paper, metal with words or a picture that gives people information, warnings
E.g.: Road signs.
- 6. Reservation** /rɛzər'veeʃən/ (noun): An arrangement to have something (such as a room, table, or seat) for your use at a later time
E.g.: I have a hotel reservation.
