


## ✓✓ Unit 4A

- Article** /'ri:d/ (verb): 'aetikel/ (noun): A piece of writing about a subject that is in a magazine, newspaper, etc.  
**E.g.:** A newspaper article.
- Famous** /'feiməs/ (adjective): known about by many people in many places  
**E.g.:** A famous actor.
- Businessman** /'biz.nis.mən/ (noun): a man who works in business, especially one who has a high position in a company:  
**E.g.:** He was a successful businessman before becoming a writer.
- Founder** /'faʊn.də/ (noun): someone who establishes an organization:  
**E.g.:** She is the founder and managing director of the company.
- Difficult** /dɪfɪkəlti/ (noun): If you have difficulty doing something, it is difficult for you to do  
**E.g.:** I have difficulty speaking Turkish language.
- Follow** /fələʊ/ (verb): To go, walk, drive etc behind or after someone else  
**E.g.:** Are those men following us?
- Paparazzi** /,pa:.pa:.'ra:t.sɪ/ (noun): the photographers who follow famous people everywhere they go in order to take photographs of them for newspapers and magazines
- Advantage** /əd'ventɪdʒ/ (noun): Something that helps you to be more successful than others, or the state of having this **OPP** Disadvantage  
**E.g.:** She had a big advantage over other contestants.
- Jealous** /dʒel.əs/ (adjective): upset and angry because someone that you love seems interested in another person:  
**E.g.:** Anna says she feels jealous every time another woman looks at her boyfriend.

- Medical** (adjective): related to the treatment of illness and injuries:  
**E.g.:** medical advice
- Married** /'merid/ (adjective): Having a husband or wife  
**E.g.:** A married man.

**1. Bored** /bɔːrd/ (adjective): tired because you do not think something is interesting, or because you have nothing to do

**E.g.:** I am bored with my job.

**2. On call** / (idiom): If a worker such as a doctor is on call, he or she is available to work or make official visits at any time when needed:  
**E.g.:** She's a doctor, so she's often on call at the weekend

**3. Probably** /'prə:bəbli/ (adverb): Maybe  
**E.g.:** It probably takes about one week.

**4. Cardiac** / kə:r.di.æk / (adjective):

**6. Routine** /ru'tin/ (noun): everyday activities  
**E.g.:** I do my daily routine.

**7. Tube** / tu:b/ (noun): the London Underground: the system of trains that run under the ground there:  
**E.g.:** Let's get the Tube.

**8. Choir** / kwair/ / (noun): a group of people who sing together:  
**E.g.:** He sings in the church choir.



**9. A little bit** : a small amount of something  
**E.g.:** With a little bit of luck we should finish by five o'clock.

**10. Cereal** /'sɪəriəl/ (noun): A breakfast food eaten with milk  
**E.g.:** A bowl of breakfast cereal.

**11. Jam** /dʒæm/ (noun): A thick sweet substance made from boiled fruit and sugar, eaten especially on bread  
**E.g.:** Strawberry jam

**12. Terrible** / terɪbəl/ (adjective): extremely bad. **SYN:** Awful  
**E.g.:** A terrible accident.

**13. Extra** /'ekstrə/ (adjective): More of something  
**E.g.:** Can you give me an extra loaf of bread?

**14. Library** /'laɪbrəri/ (noun): A place where books, magazines, and other materials (such as videos and musical recordings) are available for people to use or borrow  
**E.g.:** I need to study for my exam in the library because it is so quiet.



## 15. Social media / səʊ.ʃəl 'mi:.di.ə/

(noun):

websites and computer programs that allow people to communicate and share information on the internet using a computer or mobile phone:

**E.g.:** Companies are increasingly making use of social media in order to market their goods.

## 16. Promise /'prə:mɪs/ (verb): To tell someone that you will definitely do or provide something or that something will happen

**E.g.:** She's promised to get a good score.

**4. Recent** //rɪsəntli/ (adverb): not long ago

**E.g.:** I saw him recently for the first time in many years.

**5. Stressed** /strest/ (adjective): so worried and tired that you cannot relax

**E.g.:** I felt stressed before exam.

**6. Hair stylist** / heə.staɪlist/ (noun): someone whose job is

to cut and arrange people's hair:

**E.g.:** I've been going to the same hairstylist for years.

**7. In a hurry** (idiom): to be going somewhere very quickly, usually because you are late

**8. Island** / 'aɪ.lənd/ (noun):

a piece of land completely surrounded by water

**E.g.:** a Pacific island



**9. Seaweed** / 'si:.wi:d/ (noun): a green, brown, or dark red plant that grows in the sea or on land very close to

the sea

## ✓✓ Unit 4C

### 1. Calendar / kæləndə \$ -ər / (noun):

a set of pages that show the days, weeks, and months of a particular year, that you usually hang on a wall

**E.g.:** a desk calendar

### 2. Similar /'sɪmələr/ (adjective): Almost the same as someone or something else

**E.g.:** Our cats are similar in size.

### 3. Trouble / trʌbəl / (noun): problems or difficulties

**E.g.:** We're having a lot of trouble with the new computer system.

**10. Ceremony** / serəməni \$ -məuni/  
(noun): an important social  
or religious event, when a traditional set  
of actions is performed in a formal way  
**E.g.:** the opening ceremony of the  
Olympic Games

**11. In common:** in the same way as someone or something:  
**E.g.:** In common with many mothers, she feels torn between her family and her work.

**12. Construction** /kən'strʌkʃən/ (noun):  
The process of building something  
E.g.: The construction of a new airport.
