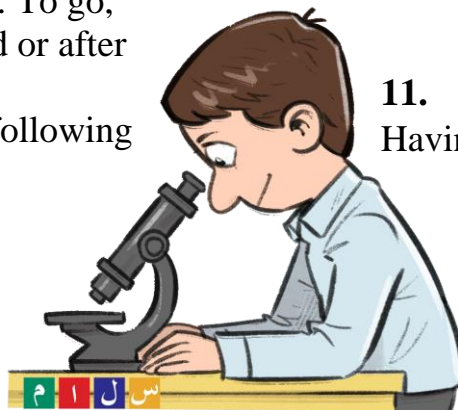


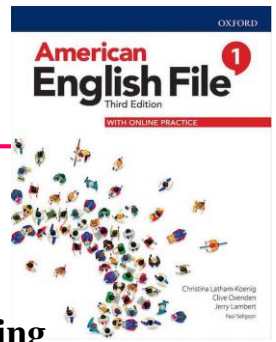


✓✓ Unit 4A

1. **Article** /'ri:d/ (verb): 'æti:kəl/ (noun):
A piece of writing about a subject that is in a magazine, newspaper, etc.
E.g.: A newspaper article.
2. **Famous** /'feiməs/ (adjective): known about by many people in many places
E.g.: A famous actor.
3. **Businessman** /'biz.nis.mən/ (noun): a man who works in business, especially one who has a high position in a company:
E.g.: He was a successful businessman before becoming a writer.
4. **Founder** /'faʊn.də/ (noun): someone who establishes an organization:
E.g.: She is the founder and managing director of the company.
5. **Difficult** /dɪfɪkəlti/ (noun): If you have difficulty doing something, it is difficult for you to do
E.g.: I have difficulty speaking Turkish language.
6. **Follow** /faləʊ/ (verb): To go, walk, drive etc behind or after someone else
E.g.: Are those men following us?
7. **Paparazzi** /,pɑ:.pɑ: 'rɑ:t.si/ (noun): the photographers who follow famous people everywhere they go in order to take photographs of them for newspapers and magazines
8. **Advantage** /əd'væntɪdʒ/ (noun): Something that helps you to be more successful than others, or the state of having this **OPP** Disadvantage
E.g.: She had a big advantage over other contestants.
9. **Jealous** /dʒel.əs/ (adjective): upset and angry because someone that you love seems interested in another person:
E.g.: Anna says she feels jealous every time another woman looks at her boyfriend.
10. **Medical** (adjective): related to the treatment of illness and injuries:
E.g.: medical advice
11. **Married** /'merɪd/ (adjective): Having a husband or wife
E.g.: A married man.

1. **Bored** /bɔːd/ (adjective): tired because you do not think something is interesting, or because you have nothing to do

E.g.: I am bored with my job.

2. **On call** / (idiom): If a worker such as a doctor is on call, he or she is available to work or make official visits at any time when needed:

E.g.: She's a doctor, so she's often on call at the weekend

3. **Probably** /'prɒbəbli/ (adverb): Maybe
E.g.: It probably takes about one week.

4. **Cardiac** /kɑːr.di.æk/ (adjective):

6. **Routine** /ruː'tin/ (noun): everyday activities
E.g.: I do my daily routine.

7. **Tube** /tuːb/ (noun): the London Underground:
the system of trains that run under the ground there:
E.g.: Let's get the Tube.

8. **Choir** /kwaɪə/ (noun): a group of people who sing together:
E.g.: He sings in the church choir.

9. **A little bit** : a small amount of something
E.g.: With a little bit of luck we should finish by five o'clock.

10. **Cereal** /'sɪəriəl/ (noun): A breakfast food eaten with milk
E.g.: A bowl of breakfast cereal.

11. **Jam** /dʒæm/ (noun): A thick sweet substance made from boiled fruit and sugar, eaten especially on bread
E.g.: Strawberry jam

12. **Terrible** /terɪbəl/ (adjective): extremely bad. **SYN:** Awful
E.g.: A terrible accident.

13. **Extra** /'ekstrə/ (adjective): More of something
E.g.: Can you give me an extra loaf of bread?

14. **Library** /'laɪbrəri/ (noun): A place where books, magazines, and other materials (such as videos and musical recordings) are available for people to use or borrow
E.g.: I need to study for my exam in the library because it is so quiet.





15. Social media / soʊ.ʃəl 'mi:.di.ə/

(noun):

websites and computer programs that allow people to communicate and share information on the internet using a computer or mobile phone:

E.g.: Companies are increasingly making use of social media in order to market their goods.

16. Promise / 'prɑ:mɪs/ (verb): To tell someone that you will definitely do or provide something or that something will happen

E.g.: She's promised to get a good score.

4. Recent //risəntli/ (adverb): not long ago

E.g.: I saw him recently for the first time in many years.

5. Stressed /strest/ (adjective): so worried and tired that you cannot relax

E.g.: I felt stressed before exam.

6. Hair stylist / heə.staɪ.lɪst/ (noun): someone whose job is to cut and arrange people's hair:

E.g.: I've been going to the same hairstylist for years.

7. In a hurry (idiom): to be going somewhere very quickly, usually because you are late

8. Island / 'aɪ.lənd/ (noun): a piece of land completely surrounded by water

E.g.: a Pacific island



9. Seaweed / 'si:.wi:d/ (noun): a green, brown, or dark red plant that grows in the sea or on land very close to the sea

1. Calendar / kæləndə \$ -ər / (noun):

a set of pages that show the days, weeks, and months of a particular year, that you usually hang on a wall

E.g.: a desk calendar

2. Similar / 'sɪmələr/ (adjective): Almost the same as someone or something else

E.g.: Our cats are similar in size.

3. Trouble / trʌbəl/ (noun): problems or difficulties

E.g.: We're having a lot of trouble with the new computer system.



10. Ceremony / serəməni \$ -məʊni/

(noun): an important social or religious event, when a traditional set of actions is performed in a formal way

E.g.: the opening ceremony of the Olympic Games

11. In common: in the same way as someone or something:

E.g.: In common with many mothers, she feels torn between her family and her work.

12. Construction /kən'strʌkʃən/ (noun):

The process of building something

E.g.: The construction of a new airport.
