1. **Audition** / ə: 'dʒ.ən / (noun):
a short performance that
an actor, musician, dancer, etc. gives
in order to show they are suitable for
a particular play, film, show, etc.:
E.g.: His audition went well and
he's fairly hopeful about getting the part.
2. **Competition** / kɒm.pə'tɪʃ.ən / (noun):
a situation in which someone
is trying to win something or be
more successful than someone else:
E.g.: There's a lot of
competition between computer companies.
3. **Judges** / 'dʒʌdʒ/ (noun): A person who decides
the winner in a contest or competition.
E.g.: Simon Cowell is a judge on American got
talent TV show.
4. **Possible** / ɒpsəbəl \$ 'pə:-// (adjective): if
something is possible, it can be done
or achieved
E.g.: Is it possible to get tickets for the game?
5. **Musical Instrument** (noun): an object, such
as a piano, guitar, or drum, that
is played to produce musical sounds:
6. **Talent** / tælənt/ (adjective): a natural ability to
do something well
E.g.: He has a lot of talent, and his work is
fresh and interesting.
7. **Logo** / ləʊ.ɡoʊ/ (noun):
a design or symbol used by
a company to advertise its products:
E.g.: The players wore shirts with the
sponsor's logo.


8. **Individual** / ɪndə'vɪdʒuəl / (adjective):
considered separately from other people or things in the same group
E.g.: Each individual leaf on the tree is different.

9. **Poem** / pəʊ.im/ (noun): a piece of writing in which the words are arranged in separate lines, often ending in rhyme, and are chosen for their sound and for the images and ideas they suggest:
E.g.: I love Hafez poems.

10. **Nervous** / 'nərvəs/ (adjective): Having or showing feelings of being worried and afraid about what might happen
E.g.: She is nervous about her job interview.

11. **Turn** / tɜːn/ (noun): an opportunity or a duty to do something at a particular time or in a particular order, before or after other people:
E.g.: I waited so long for my turn to see the careers adviser that I missed my bus.

- Bark** / ba:rk / (verb): when a dog barks, it makes a short loud sound or series of sounds
E.g.: The dog always barks at strangers.
- Argue** / a:rg.ju: / (verb): to speak angrily to someone, telling that person that you disagree with them:
E.g.: The children are always arguing.
- Interview** /'intərvju:/ (verb): To question or talk with (someone) in order to get information or learn about that person.
E.g.: He has interviewed with many companies, but he still hasn't found a job.
- Impossible** (adjective): if something is impossible, it cannot be done or achieved
E.g.: we are late it is impossible to get there on time?
- Yard** / jard/ (noun): A closed area next to a building or group of buildings, used for a special purpose, activity, or business
E.g.: Boys are playing in the yard.

- Neighbor** / nei·bər / (noun): someone who lives near you:
E.g.: my next door neighbor is a Chinese man.
- Regular** / 'reg.jə.lər / (noun): usual or ordinary
E.g.: He drove his regular route to work.
- Platform** / platfɔ:rm/ (noun): A flat area next to railroad tracks where people wait for a train or subway
E.g.: Our train is boarding on platform 6.
- Contract** / kəntrækt \$ 'ka:n- / (noun): an official agreement between two or more people, stating what each will do
E.g.: Tyler has agreed a seven-year contract with a Hollywood studio.

- Temperature** / 'tem.prə.tʃər / (noun): the measured amount of heat in a place or in the body:
E.g.: Preheat the oven to a temperature of 200 degrees Celsius.
- Freezing** / fri:zɪŋ / (adjective): extremely cold
E.g.: It's freezing in this house. Can't I turn on the heating?
- Boat** / bəʊt / (noun): a small vehicle for travelling on water:
E.g.: a rowing/sailing boat
- Including** / in'klu:.dɪŋ / (preposition): used for saying that a person or thing is part of a particular group or amount:
E.g.: Eight people, including two children, were injured in the explosion.
- Meal** / miːl / (noun): an occasion when food is eaten, or the food that is eaten on such an occasion:
E.g.: a hot meal
- Cool** / ku:l / (adjective): low in temperature, but not cold, often in a way that feels pleasant
E.g.: She swam out into the cool water.
- Popular** / pa:.pjə.lər / (adjective): liked, enjoyed, or supported by many people:
E.g.: She's the most popular teacher in school.
- Route** / ru:t / (noun): a particular way or direction between places:
E.g.: The route we had planned took us right across Greece.
- Sculpture** / 'skʌlpʃə \$ -ər / (noun): an object made out of stone, wood, clay etc by an artist
E.g.: a sculpture of an elephant



- Visitors** / 'vɪz.i.tər / (noun): someone who visits a person or place:
E.g.: You have some visitors to see you.

- Wonderful** / wʌn.dər.fəl / (adjective): extremely good:
E.g.: He's a wonderful cook.

- Amazing** / ə'meɪ.zɪŋ / (adjective): extremely surprising:
E.g.: The new theatre is going to cost an amazing (= very large) amount of money.

- Below** / bɪ'ləʊ / (adverb): in a lower position (than), under:
E.g.: From the top of the skyscraper the cars below us looked like insects.

- Foggy** / fa:.gi / (adjective): if the weather is foggy, there is fog
E.g.: a foggy day in November

- Prepared** / pri'perd / (verb): ready to deal with a situation:
E.g.: When she called on me, I wasn't prepared.

- Politicians** / pɒlə'tɪʃən \$,pa:- / (noun): someone who works in politics, especially an elected member of the government
E.g.: politicians who are trying to get the minority vote
