1. **Victim** /vɪk.təm/ (noun): someone or something that has been hurt, damaged, or killed or has suffered, either because of the actions of someone or something else, or because of illness or chance:
E.g.: victims of crime
2. **Suspect** / sə'spekt/ (noun): a person believed to have committed a crime or done something wrong, or something believed to have caused something bad:
E.g.: Police have issued a photograph of the suspect.
3. **Detective** / dɪ'tektɪv/ (noun): Someone whose job is to find who did a crime
E.g.: Gadget detective cartoon.
4. **Mustache** / mʌstæʃ/ (noun): Hair that grows above a man's mouth
E.g.: He shaved his moustache.
5. **Asleep** / ə'slɪp/ (adjective): Sleeping OPP Awake
E.g.: Quiet! The baby's asleep.

1. **Advertisement** / əd'veɪtaɪzment/ (noun): A public notice that tells people about products or things that are happening
E.g.: I watched tantak advertisement on TV.
2. **Furniture** / fɜrnɪtʃər/ (noun): Large objects such as chairs, tables, beds
E.g.: My mother bought beautiful new furniture for my bedroom.
3. **Armchairs** / armtʃər/ (noun): A soft chair with sides that you can rest your arms on
E.g.: She was asleep on an armchair.
4. **Dishwasher** / dɪʃwɔʃər/ (noun): A machine that washes dishes
E.g.: My dishwasher doesn't work.
5. **Never mind** Not important
E.g.: Never mind about the car. You're safe, and that's the main thing.
6. **Rent** / rent/ (verb): To regularly pay money to live in a house or room
E.g.: Do you own your home or are you renting?
7. **Balcony** / bælkəni/ (noun): A structure that you can stand on, that is attached to the outside wall of a building, above ground level
E.g.: Has your flat got a balcony?
8. **Dear** dɪər : Dear friend or relative is very important to you and you love them a lot
E.g.: Mark is my dear friend.

9. **Ceiling** / siliŋ/ (noun): The part of a room over your head
E.g.: Rooms with high ceilings.
10. **Authentic** / ə'θentik/ (adjective): Real and true
OPP Fake
E.g.: Authentic work by Picasso.
11. **Guest** / gest/ (noun): Someone who is invited to an event or special occasion
E.g.: You are here as my guests.
12. **Murdered** / mɜːrdər/ (verb): Killing someone
E.g.: He murdered him with a knife.

1. **Ghost** / goʊst/ (noun): the spirit of a dead person, sometimes represented as a pale, almost transparent image of that person that some people believe appears to people who are alive:
E.g.: Do you believe in ghosts?
2. **Complained** / kəm'pleɪn/ (verb): to say that something is wrong or not satisfactory:
E.g.: Lots of people have complained about the noise.
3. **Reception** / rɪ'sepʃən/ (noun): the place in a hotel or office building where people go when they first arrive:
E.g.: I signed in at the reception desk.
4. **Well-known** / wel 'nəʊn/ (adjective): known and recognize by many people
E.g.: Her views on the subject are already well known.

5. **Situated** / sɪtʃ.u.eɪ.tɪd/ (verb): to put something in a particular position:
E.g.: They plan to situate the bus stop at the corner of the road.
6. **Reputation** / rep.jə'teɪʃən/ (noun): the general opinion that people have about someone or something:
E.g.: His work in Congress won him a reputation as reliable and industrious.
7. **Claim** / kleɪm/ (verb): to say that something is true or is a fact, although you cannot prove it and other people might not believe it:
E.g.: The company claims (that) it is not responsible for the pollution in the river.
8. **Ballroom** / ba:l.rəm/ (noun): a large room that is used for formal dancing
9. **Fabulous** / fæb.jə.ləs/ (adjective): very good; excellent:
E.g.: She looked absolutely fabulous in her dress.
10. **Psychic** / saɪ.kɪk/ (adjective): having a special mental ability, for example so that you are able to know what will happen in the future or know what people are thinking:
E.g.: psychic powers
11. **Anxiously** /æŋk.jəs.li/ (adverb): in a way that shows you are worried or nervous:
E.g.: We waited anxiously by the phone.
12. **Cupboard** / kʌbərd/ (noun): A piece of furniture with doors, and sometimes shelves, for storing clothes, plates, etc. → closet, wardrobe, cabinet
E.g.: It's in the kitchen cupboard.
13. **Charity** / tʃærəti/ (noun): An organization that gives money, goods, or help to people who are poor, sick
E.g.: Mahak is a charity.



14. **Scream** / skri:m/ (verb): to make a loud, high sound:

E.g.: he ambulance raced round the corner with its tyres screaming.

15. **Castel** / kæsəl/ (noun): A very large strong building, built in the past as a safe place that could be easily defended against attack.

E.g.: Edinburgh castle is in Scotland.

16. **Elegant** / el.ə.gənt/ (adjective):

graceful and attractive in appearance or behavi or

E.g.: We met a young businesswoman, elegant in a black suit.

17. **Softly** / sa:ft.li/ (adverb): gently

E.g.: She speaks softly but usually gets her own way.

18. **Frightened** / fraitnd/ (adjective): Feeling afraid

SYN Scared

E.g.: Don't be frightened. We're not going to hurt you.

19. **Thin** / θɪn/ (adjective): having

a small distance between two opposite sides

E.g.: Did you notice how thin her wrists were
