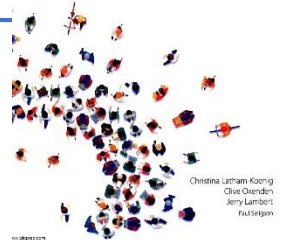




✓✓ Unit 10A

1. **Rugby** /'rʌɡbi/ (noun):
an outdoor game played by two teams with an oval(=egg-shaped) ball that you kick or carry
E.g.: Very few people want to play rugby league.
2. **wind-surfing** /'wind ,sɜːfɪŋ \$ - ,sɜːr-/ (noun):
the sport of sailing across water by standing on a surfboard and holding on to a large sail attached to the surfboard
E.g.: On the hotel's private beach, wind-surfing can be arranged, and there are tennis courts.
3. **Commentary** /'kɒməntəri \$ 'kɑːməntəri/ (noun):
a spoken description of an event, given while the event is happening, especially on the television or radio
E.g.: Commentary is by Tom Ferris.
4. **Defender** /dɪ'fendə \$ -ər/ (noun):
one of the players in a game such as football who has to defend their team's goal from the opposing team
E.g.: It's his fourth season as an Arsenal defender.
5. **Goalkeeper** /'gəʊl ,ki:pə \$ 'gəʊl ,ki:pər/ (noun):
the player in a sports team whose job is to try to stop the ball going into the goal
SYN goaltender American English
E.g.: Specialist positions such as goalkeeper and striker would be joined by the mediator and even ambassador.
6. **Hoop** /hu:p \$ hʊp, hu:p/ (noun):
a large ring made of wood, metal, plastic etc
E.g.: They chant their tables before playtime with tops, skipping ropes and hoops.
7. **Track** /træk/ (noun):
sport that involves running on a track
E.g.: The next year he didn't run track or play football. all the sports in an athletics competition such as running, jumping, or throwing the javelin
E.g.: a famous track star
8. **Forum** /'fɔːrəm/ (noun):
a group of computer users who are interested in a particular subject and discuss it using email or the Internet
E.g.: The association began as a forum for sharing ideas about management problems.
9. **Athlete** /'æθli:t/ (noun):
someone who competes in sports competitions, especially running, jumping, and throwing
E.g.: a professional athlete
10. **Parkrun** (noun):
a collection of five-kilometre running events that take place every Saturday morning in several countries
E.g.: Every weekend, a parkrun takes place in my local park, as it does in parks all over the country.

11. **Serve** /sɜ:v \$ sɜ:rv/ (verb):
to start playing in a game such as tennis or volleyball by throwing the ball up in the air **E.g.:** Keep warm until ready to serve.
12. **Opponent** /ə'pəʊnənt \$ ə'pou-/ (noun):
someone who you try to defeat in a competition, game, fight, or argument **E.g.:** Graf's opponent in today's final will be Sukova.
13. **Return** /rɪ'tɜ:n \$ -ɜ:rn/ (verb):
to give or send something back, or to put something back in its place SYN give back, put back **E.g.:** I returned the books to the library unread.
14. **Identical** /aɪ'dentɪkəl/ (adjective):
exactly the same, or very similar **E.g.:** four identical houses
15. **Inferior** /ɪn'fɪəriə \$ -'fɪriə/ adjective
not good, or not as good as someone or something else
OPP superior
E.g.: I felt very inferior among all those academics.

1. **Baker** /'beɪkə \$ -ər/ (noun):
someone who bakes bread and cakes, especially in order to sell them in a shop **E.g.:** Although trained as a baker, Hilprecht had been on the dole since doing his military service.
2. **Separable** /'sepərəbəl/ (adjective):
two things that are separable can be separated or considered separately **OPP inseparable**
E.g.: Physical health is not always easily separable from mental health.
3. **Concentrate** /'kɒnsəntreɪt \$ 'kɑ:n-/ (verb):
to think very carefully about something that you are doing **E.g.:** Now please concentrate.

1. **Invention** /ɪn'venʃən/ (noun):
a useful machine, tool, instrument etc
that has been invented
E.g.: The dishwasher is a wonderful
invention.
2. **hot-air balloon** (noun):
a large balloon filled with hot air, used for
carrying people up into the sky
E.g.: Perhaps the engine of an abandoned
car will start or a hot-air balloon will
materialize
3. **Inventor** /ɪn'ventə \$ -ər/ (noun):
someone who has invented something,
or whose job is to invent things
E.g.: Marconi was the inventor of
radio.
4. **Diaper** /'daɪəpə \$ 'daɪpər/ (noun):
American English a piece of soft cloth
or soft paper that is put between a
baby's legs and fastened around its
waist to hold liquid and solid waste
SYN nappy British English
E.g.: I changed my little son's diaper.
