


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✓✓ Unit 3A

- Arrivals** /ə'raɪv(ə)lz/ (noun):
the place at an airport where people arrive when they get off a plane
E.g.: the arrivals lounge
- Baggage** /'bægɪdʒ/ (noun):
especially American English the cases, bags, boxes etc carried by someone who is travelling
SYN: luggage
E.g.: Check your baggage in at the desk.
- Departures** /dɪ'pa:tʃə \$ -'pa:rtʃər/ (noun):
the part of an airport that deals with passengers who are leaving. / an act of leaving a place, especially at the start of a journey
E.g.: There are several departures a day for New York.
- Foggy** /'fɒgi \$ 'fa:gi, 'fɔ:gi/ (adjective):
if the weather is foggy, there is fog
E.g.: a foggy day in November
- Region** /'ri:dʒən/ (noun):
a large area of a country or of the world, usually without exact limits
SYN: area
E.g.: efforts to bring peace to the region

- Layover** /'leɪəvər/ (noun):
American English a short stay between parts of a journey, especially a long plane journey
SYN: stopover British English
E.g.: During layovers I spent less time lounging by the pool and more time exploring.
- connecting flight** /kə'nektɪŋ flait/ (noun):
a flight taken from an airport other than that from which the journey began, and which is taken in a different aeroplane from that used for the previous stage of the journey
E.g.: The group was on a flight to Detroit where they planned to catch a connecting flight to Gatwick.
- Lounge** /laʊndʒ/ (noun):
a waiting room at an airport
E.g.: There's no dining room or lounge, but guests can have a self-service breakfast for £2.50.





9. Frustrating /frʌ'streɪtɪŋ \$ 'frʌstreɪtɪŋ/ (adjective):

making you feel annoyed, upset, or impatient because you cannot do what you want to do

E.g.: My job can be very frustrating sometimes.

10. Sight /saɪt/ (noun):

the act of seeing something

E.g.: The house is hidden from sight behind trees

11. Expanded /ɪk'spændɪd/ (adjective):

being or having been enlarged or extended. / wider than usual for a particular height / increased in size, area, scope, etc.

E.g.: In fact, exterior walls became interior ones as the museum collection expanded.

12. Worldwide /wɜːld'waɪd/ (adjective, adverb):

everywhere in the world → globally

E.g.: We have offices in over 56 countries worldwide.

13. duty-free

/dʒuː.ti'fri://, du:.ti'fri:/

(adjective):

duty-free goods can be brought into a country

without paying tax on them

E.g.: the duty-free shop

14. terrified /'terɪfaɪd/ (adjective):

very frightened

E.g.: a terrified little girl

15. forecast /'fɔːkə:st/ (noun):

a description of what is likely to happen in the future, based on the information that you have now → prediction

E.g.: The weather forecast is good for tomorrow.






✓✓ Unit 3A – Listening

1. **tour guide** /'gaɪd/ (noun):
a person employed to show tourists around places of interest.
E.g.: Our tour guide explained the church's history.

2. **parking lot** /'pa:.kɪŋ ,lɒt/ /'pa:r.kɪŋ ,la:t/ (noun):
an open area for cars to park in
SYN: car park British English
E.g.: The office and the parking lot were in a little clearing surrounded by large trees.

3. **Pleasure** /'pleʒə \$ -ər/ (noun):
the feeling of happiness, enjoyment, or satisfaction that you get from an experience
E.g.: She sipped her drink with obvious pleasure.



4. **Carbonara** /,ka:.bə'na:.rə/ /,ka:r.bə'na:rə/ (adjective):
denoting a pasta sauce typically made with cured pork, egg, and grated cheese.

E.g.: I love spaghetti carbonara

5. **Typical** /'tipɪkəl/ (adjective):
having the usual features or qualities of a particular group or thing
E.g.: Pancake is a typical dish in Ukraine.

✓✓ Unit 3B

1. **look through**
somebody/something (phrasal verb):
to look for something among a pile of papers, in a drawer, in someone's pockets etc
SYN: go through
E.g.: I've looked through all my papers but I still can't find the contract.

2. **Wardrobe** /'wɔ:drəʊb \$ 'wɔ:rdrəʊb/ (noun):
the clothes that someone has
E.g.: You can win a complete new wardrobe.

3. **Recommended** /,rek.ə'men.dɪd \$,rek.ə'men.dɪd/ (adjective):
suggested as being good or suitable for a particular job or purpose, or suggested as an action that should be done
E.g.: She is a highly recommended architect.

4. **last-minute** /la:st 'minit \$,læst 'minit/ (adjective)
[only before noun]
happening or done as late as possible before something else happens
E.g.: a few last-minute changes to the script



✓✓ Unit 3B – Listening

1. **climate change** /'klaɪmət tʃeɪndʒ/ (noun):

a permanent change in the Earth's weather conditions

E.g.: Human activity has led to deforestation, species becoming extinct, rising sea levels and climate change.

✓✓ Unit 3C

1. **Scrabble** /'skræbəl/ (noun):

a game in which players try to make words from the separate letters they have

E.g.: Ruth and I played a spiritless game of Scrabble.

2. **Crossword** /'krɒswɜ:d/ \$ /'krɒ:swɜ:rd/ (noun):

a word game in which you write the answers to questions in a pattern of numbered boxes

E.g.: I like to sit down and do the crossword.

3. **Contestant** /kən'testənt/ (noun):

someone who competes in a contest

E.g.: Contestants for the game show go through a tough selection process.

4. **Prize** /praɪz/ (noun):

something that is given to someone who is successful in a competition, race, game of chance etc

E.g.: The first prize has gone to Dr John Gentle.

5. **Wheel** /wi:l/ (noun):

one of the round things under a car, bus, bicycle etc that turns when it moves

E.g.: The car slid sideways, its rear wheels spinning.



6. **Host** /həʊst/ \$ /hoʊst/ (noun):

someone who introduces and talks to the guests on a television or radio programme

SYN compere British English

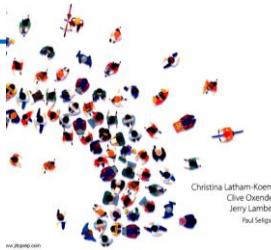
E.g.: a game show host

7. **sunbathe** /'sʌnbəið/ (verb):

to sit or lie outside in the sun, especially in order to become brown

E.g.: Her mother was sunbathing in the back garden.

** There is no noun 'sunbath': Let's go and sunbathe/do some sunbathing (NOT have a sunbath).



Practical 2

1. Meal /mi:l/ (noun):

an occasion when you eat food, for example breakfast or dinner, or the food that you eat on that occasion

E.g.: We must have a meal together some time.

2. Tuna /'tju:nə/ 'tu:nə/ (noun):

a large sea fish caught for food

E.g.: He made two rounds of tuna sandwiches
