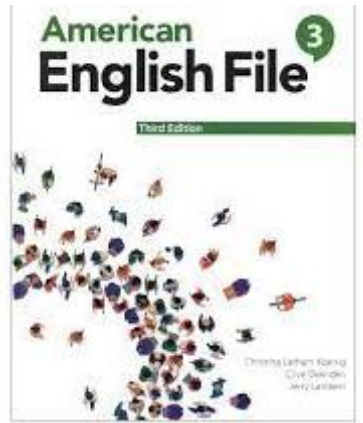


## ✓✓ Unit 6A

1. **Mime** /maɪm/ noun  
the use of movements to express what you want to say without using words, or a play where the actors use only movements  
The children learn through role-play, dance and mime.
2. **Obsess** /əb'ses/ verb  
if something or someone obsesses you, you think or worry about them all the time and you cannot think about anything else – used to show disapproval  
A lot of young girls are obsessed by their weight.
3. **Set** /set/ noun  
someone who is set for something is ready for it  
Are you all set for the trip?
4. **put up** /phrasal verb  
to stay in a place for a short time  
Well, each of us had to put up with different things to earn our food.
5. **Insurgent** /ɪn'sɜːdʒənt \$ -ɜːr/ noun  
one of a group of people fighting against the government of their own country, or against authority  
SYN rebel  
communist insurgents
6. **Strictly** /'striktli/ adverb  
in a way that must be obeyed  
Alcohol is strictly forbidden on school premises.
7. **Epic** /'epɪk/ noun  
a book, poem, or film that tells a long story about brave actions and exciting events  
a Hollywood epic
8. **Funeral** /'fjuːnərəl/ noun  
a religious ceremony for burying or cremating (=burning) someone who has died  
The funeral will be held at St. Martin's Church.
9. **Digitize** /'dɪdʒətaɪz/ verb  
to put information into a digital form  
To create special effects, engineers digitize the film and then work with it on computer.





**10. cut out** /phrasal verb

to cut a shape from a piece of paper, cloth etc  
The children were cutting out squares from the scraps of material.

**11. Cardboard** /'kɑ:dbɔ:d \$

'kɑ:rdbɔ:rd/ noun  
stiff thick brown paper, used especially for making boxes  
a sheet of cardboard

**12. Inflatable** /m'fleɪtəbəl/ adjective

an inflatable object has to be filled with air before you can use it  
an inflatable mattress

**13. Dub** /dʌb/ verb to change the original spoken language of a film or television programme into another language

a British film dubbed into French

**14. Critic** /'kɹɪtɪk/ noun

someone whose job is to make judgments about the good and bad qualities of art, music, films etc  
SYN reviewer  
a review by the theatre critic of the 'Sunday Times'

**15. Review** /rɪ'vju:/

noun  
an article in a newspaper or magazine that gives an opinion about a new book, play, film etc  
a film review

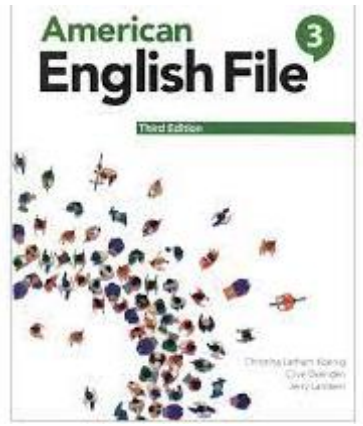
**16. Memorable** /'memərəbəl/ adjective

very good, enjoyable, or unusual, and worth remembering  
We want to make this a truly memorable day for the children.

✓✓ Unit 6A - Listening

- 1. Coincidence** /kəʊ'ɪnsɪdəns \$ kou-/ noun when two things happen at the same time, in the same place, or to the same people in a way that seems surprising or unusual  
'I'm going to Appleby tomorrow.'  
'What a coincidence! I'm going there too.'
- 2. Courage** /'kʌrɪdʒ \$ 'kɜ:r-/ noun the quality of being brave when you are facing a difficult or dangerous situation, or when you are very ill  
Sue showed great courage throughout her illness.

**1. Entirely** /ɪn'taɪəli \$ -'taɪr-/ adverb  
completely and in every possible way  
Our situation is entirely different.

**2. Accomplished**  
/ə'kʌmplɪʃt \$ ə'kɑ:m-, ə'kʌm /  
adjective  
an accomplished writer, painter, singer  
etc is very skilful  
a highly accomplished designer

**3. Fabulous** /'fæbjələs/ adjective  
extremely good or impressive  
SYN wonderful  
You look fabulous!

**4. Diaper** /'daɪəpə \$ 'daɪpər/ noun  
a piece of soft cloth or soft paper that  
is put between a baby's legs and  
fastened around its waist to hold liquid  
and solid waste  
SYN nappy British English  
I changed her diaper.

**5. Slogan** /'sləʊgən \$ 'sləʊ-/ noun  
a short phrase that is easy to remember  
and is used in advertisements, or by  
politicians, organizations etc  
an advertising slogan

## 6. Regret

/rɪ'ɡret/ verb

to feel sorry about something  
you have done and wish you  
had not done it

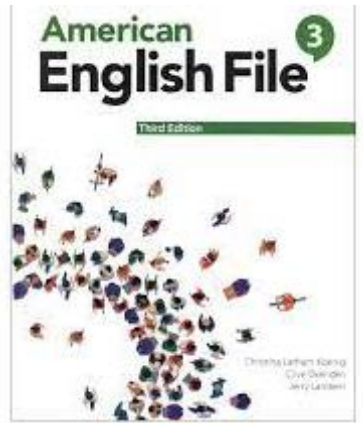
Don't do anything you might  
regret.

**7. Incompetent** /ɪn'kɒmpɪtənt \$ -  
'kɑ:m-/ adjective  
not having the ability or skill to  
do a job properly  
OPP competent  
an incompetent manager

**8. Adore** /ə'dɔː \$ ə'dɔːr/ verb  
to love someone very much and  
feel very proud of them  
Betty adores her grandchildren.

**9. Dedicated** /'dedɪkeɪtɪd/  
adjective  
someone who is dedicated  
works very hard at what they do  
because they care a lot about it  
a dedicated and thoughtful  
teacher

**10. Probable** /'prɒbəbəl \$ 'praː-/  
adjective  
likely to exist, happen, or be  
true  
The probable cause of the fire  
was faulty wiring.



**11. Charisma** /kə'rizmə/ noun  
a natural ability to attract and  
interest other people and make  
them admire you  
He lacks charisma.

**12. Chin** /tʃɪn/ noun  
the front part of your face below  
your mouth He rubbed his chin  
thoughtfully.

**1. Demanding** /dɪ'mɑ:ndɪŋ \$  
dɪ'mæn-/ adjective  
needing a lot of ability, effort, or  
skill  
a demanding job

**2. Trip** /trɪp/ verb  
to hit something with your foot  
by accident so that you fall or  
almost fall  
SYN stumble  
He tripped and fell.

**3. Twisted** /'twɪstɪd/ adjective  
something twisted has been bent  
in many directions or turned  
many times, so that it has lost its  
original shape  
the plane's twisted wreckage.

**4. Premier**  
/'premiə \$  
pri'mɪr/ adjective  
best or most important  
one of Dublin's premier hotels.

**5. Attention** /ə'tenʃən/ noun  
when you carefully listen to,  
look at, or think about someone  
or something  
My attention wasn't really on the  
game.

**6. Concentrate** /'kɒnsəntreɪt \$  
'kɔ:n-/ verb  
to think very carefully about  
something that you are doing  
Now please concentrate.
