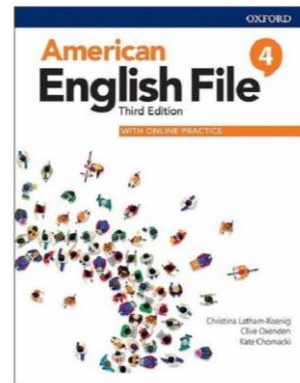


### A. Find the mistake in each sentence
