**1. Nationality** /næʃə'naeləti/ (noun):  
(plural **nationalities**): a citizen of a particular country – citizenship  
**E.g.:** He has British nationality.

**2. Shower** /'ʃawər/ (verb): To wash yourself

**E.g.:** Please shower before using the pool.



**3. Chess** /'tʃes/ (noun): A game for two players and each player moves 16 pieces across a board and tries to put the opponent's king in a position that it cannot escape

**E.g.:** We played (a game of) chess.



**4. Seat** /si:t/ (noun): A place for sitting  
**E.g.:** There are seats for six people at the table.

**5. Free** /fri:/ (adjective): Empty or available - Not costing any money  
**E.g.:** Wi-Fi is free here.

**6. Look** /luk/ (verb): To use the eyes to see

**E.g.:** I feel happy when I look at my puppy.

**7. Different** /dɪfə'rent/ (adjective): Not like something or someone else **OPP**  
**Similar**

**E.g.:** The old house is different from other houses.

**1. Good looking** (adjective): someone who is good-looking is attractive  
**E.g.:** Don't you think Dave is good-looking?

**2. Phone number** (noun): A number that you dial on a telephone to reach a particular person, business, etc.  
**E.g.:** What's your phone number?

**3. Identity Card** (noun): a card with your name, date of birth, and photograph on it, that shows who you are **SYN ID card**

**4. Famous** /'feiməs/ (adjective): known about by many people in many places  
**E.g.:** The Eiffel Tower is a famous landmark

**5. Yard** (noun): the area around a house, usually covered with grass **SYN garden British English**



**E.g.:** The kids were playing in the back yard.
