1. **Living room** (noun): the main room in a house where people relax watch television **SYN lounge**
E.g.: my father is watching Tv in the living room

2. **Homework** / 'həʊmwɜ:k/ (noun): work that a student at school is asked to do at home
E.g.: For homework, finish the exercise on page 14.

3. **Noise** / nɔɪz/ (noun): a sound, especially one that is loud, unpleasant,



or frightening **SYN sound**

E.g.: What's that noise?

4. **Making dinner** : cook dinner or prepare dinner
E.g.: My mom is making dinner in the kitchen.

5. **Healthy** / 'helθi/ (adjective): physically strong and not likely to become ill or weak
E.g.: a healthy baby boy

6. **Interested** / 'intrɪstɪd/ (adjective): giving a lot of attention to something because you want to find out more about it or because you enjoy it

E.g.: I've always been interested in music.



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7. **Swimming pool** (noun): a structure that has been built and filled with water for people to swim in

E.g.: Do you want to go swimming in the swimming pool?



8. **wheel** / wi:l/ (noun): one of the round things under a car, bus, bicycle etc that turns when it moves

E.g.: a car has 4 wheels.

9. **Riding** / 'raɪdɪŋ/ (noun): he sport or activity of riding horses
E.g.: horse riding

10. **Movie theater** (noun): a building where you go in order to watch films **SYN cinema**

11. **Box office** (noun): the place in a theatre, cinema where tickets are sold → **ticket office**

12. **Traffic** / 'træfɪk/ (noun): the vehicles moving along a road or street

13. Direction / də'rekʃən, dai-/

(noun): the way something or someone moves, faces, or is aimed
E.g.: Which direction did they go in?

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14. Perfect / 'pɜ:fɪkt \$ 'pɜ:r-/ (adjective):

not having any mistakes, faults, or damage

E.g.: His English was perfect.

15. Suitcase / 'su:tkeɪs, 'sju:t-/ (noun): a large case with a handle, used for carrying clothes and possession when you travel

16. Looking for (phrasal verb): to try to find

something that you have lost, or someone who is not where they should be SYN search for

E.g.: I'm looking for Steve – have you seen him?



2. Repairing / rɪ'peɪɪŋ / (verb):

to fix something that is damaged, broken, split, or not working properly SYN **mend**

E.g.: Dad was up the ladder, repairing the roof.

3. Cleaning / 'kli:nɪŋ / (verb): the process or job of making a house, office etc clean

E.g.: Liz comes on Thursdays to **do the cleaning**.

4. Undercover (adjective): undercover work is done secretly by the police in order to catch criminals or find out information

E.g.: an undercover investigation

5. Workers / 'wɜ:kə/ (noun): someone who does a job, especially a particular type of job

E.g.: workers in the tourist industry

6. Manager / 'mænɪdʒə/ (noun):

someone whose job is to manage part or all of a company or other organization

E.g.: one of our regional managers

7. Suit /su:t, sju:t / (noun): a set of clothes made of the

same material, usually including a jacket with trousers or a skirt
E.g.: a business suit

1. Boss / bɒs \$ bɔ:s/ (noun):

the person who employs you or who is in charge of you at work

E.g.: I'll have to ask my boss for a day off.

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8. Oven /'oʊvər/ (noun): a piece of equipment that food is cooked inside, shaped like a metal box with a door on the front → **cooker, stove**
E.g.: Preheat the oven to 200 degrees C.

9. Inspection /ɪn'speksʃən/ (noun): an official visit to a building or organization to check that everything is satisfactory and that rules are being obeyed
E.g.: regular inspections of the prison

10. Inspector /ɪn'spektə \$ -ər/ (noun): an official whose job is to check that something is satisfactory and that rules are being obeyed
E.g.: ticket inspectors

11. Broken /'brəʊkən/ (verb): the past participle of break. It means not working

12. Waiter /'weɪtə \$ -ər/ (noun): a man who serves food and drink at the tables in a restaurant
E.g.: He'd been a **waiter** for twenty years

13. Waitress /'weɪtrɪs/ (noun): a woman who serves food and drink at the tables in a restaurant



14. Skirt /skɜ:t \$ skɜ:rt/ (noun): a piece of outer clothing worn by women and girls, which hangs down from the waist like the bottom part of a dress
E.g.: She wore a white blouse and a plain black skirt.

15. Sneakers /'sneɪkər/ (noun): a type of light soft shoe with

a rubber **sole** (=bottom), used for sports → **plimsoll**



16. Cap /kæp/ (noun): a type of flat hat that has a curved part sticking out at the front, and is often worn as part of a uniform



17. Internship /'ɪntɜ:nʃɪp \$ -ɜ:rn-/ (noun): a job that lasts for a short time, that someone, especially a student, does in order to gain experience → **intern**
E.g.: I worked for them for a summer as kind of an **internship**.

18. Experience /ɪk'spiəriəns/ (noun): knowledge or skill that you gain from doing a job or activity, or the process of doing this
E.g.: You've got a lot of experience of lecturing.



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19. Casual /'kæʒuəl/ (adjective):

not formal or not for a formal
situation **OPP formal**

E.g.: Jean felt more comfortable
in casual clothes.

20. customers /'kʌstəmər/ (noun): A

person who buys products or
services.

E.g.: This store has many customers.
