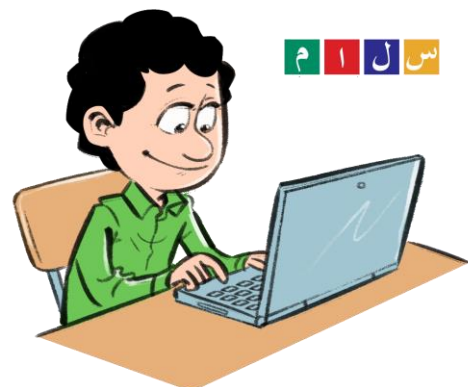


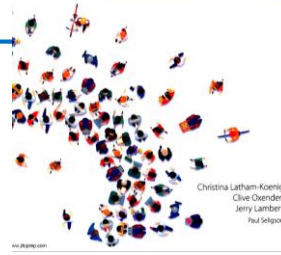
✓✓ Unit 7A

- Survive** /sə'vaɪv \$ sə-r-/ (verb):
to continue to live normally in spite of many problems
E.g.: I'm sure she will survive this crisis.
- Weather** /'weðə \$ -ər/ noun
the temperature and other conditions such as sun, rain, and wind
E.g.: What's the weather like today?
- Enthusiastic** /ɪn,θju:zi'æstɪk ◀ \$ ɪn,θu:-/ (adjective):
feeling or showing a lot of interest and excitement about something
E.g.: All the staff are enthusiastic about the project.
- Admit** /əd'mɪt/ (verb):
to agree unwillingly that something is true or that someone else is right
E.g.: "Okay, so maybe I was a little bit scared" Jenny admitted.
- Appropriate** /ə'prəʊpri-ət \$ ə'pru:-/ (adjective):
correct or suitable for a particular time, situation, or purpose
OPP inappropriate
E.g.: I didn't feel that this was an appropriate time to mention the subject of money.
- Logical** /'lɒdʒɪkəl \$ 'lɑ:-/ (adjective):
seeming reasonable and sensible
OPP illogical
E.g.: It's a logical site for a new supermarket, with the housing development nearby.

- Publishing** /'pʌblɪʃɪŋ/ (noun):
the business of producing books and magazines
E.g.: Tony wants to get a job in publishing.
- Impression** /ɪm'preʃən/ (noun):
the opinion or feeling you have about someone or something because of the way they seem
E.g.: When we looked around the school we got a very good impression.
- Observe** /əb'zɜ:v \$ -ɜ:rv/ (verb):
to see and notice something → observation
E.g.: Scientists have observed a drop in ozone levels over the Antarctic.
- run around** /ə'raʊnd/ (phrasal verb):
If you run around, you go to a lot of places and do a lot of things, often in a rushed or disorganized way.
E.g.: I spend all day running around after the family.





✓✓ **Unit 7B – Listening**

1. **illustrator** /'ɪləstreɪtə \$ -ər/ (noun):
 someone who draws pictures,
 especially for books
E.g.: Jane was an illustrator, journalist,
 writer of cheap science fiction and
 adventure novels.

2. **Refill** /,ri:'fɪl/ (verb):
 to fill something again
E.g.: The waitress refilled our coffee
 cups.

3. **Fit** /fɪt/ (verb):
 if a piece of clothing fits you, it is the
 right size for your body
E.g.: His clothes did not fit him very
 well.

4. **Possession** /pə'zefən/ (noun):
 if something is in your possession,
 you own it, or you have obtained it
 from somewhere
E.g.: That information is not in our
 possession.

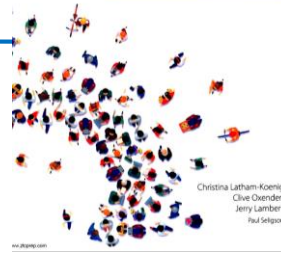
1. **Capital** (city) /'kæpɪtl/
 (noun):
 the city or town that functions as the seat
 of government and administrative centre
 of a country or region.
E.g.: Warsaw is the capital of Poland

2. **Therapist** /'θerəpɪst/ (noun):
 someone who has been trained to give a
 particular form of treatment for physical
 or mental illness
E.g.: a speech therapist

3. **Crisis** /'kraɪsɪs/ (noun):
 a situation in which there are a lot of
 problems that must be dealt with quickly
 so that the situation does not get worse or
 more dangerous → emergency
E.g.: The country now faces an
 economic crisis.

4. **Principle** /'prɪnsəpəl/ (noun):
 the basic idea that a plan or system is
 based on **E.g.:** The general principle is
 that education should be available to all
 children up to the age of 16.

7. Motivation /,məʊtə'veɪʃən \$,moʊ-/ (noun):

eagerness and willingness to do something without needing to be told or forced to do it

E.g.: Jack is an intelligent pupil, but he lacks motivation.

8. Local /'ləʊkəl \$ 'loʊ-/ (adjective): relating to the particular area you live in, or the area you are talking about

E.g.: local hospital

9. Effort /'efət \$ 'efərt/ (noun): the physical or mental energy that is needed to do something

E.g.: Lou lifted the box easily, without using much effort.

10. Multinational /,mʌltɪ'næʃənəl/ (adjective):

a multinational company has factories, offices, and business activities in many different countries

E.g.: a multinational media corporation

11. official language /ə'fɪʃəl/ (noun):

the language that is approved by the government of a country, taught in schools, and used in legal and official documents

E.g.: Croatian is the official language of Croatia.

12. Intensive /ɪn'tensɪv/ (adjective):

involving a lot of activity, effort, or careful attention in a short period of time

E.g.: a one-week intensive course in English

13. Course /kɔ:s \$ kɔ:rs/ (noun):

a series of lessons in a particular subject

SYN class

E.g.: Andy's doing a one-year journalism course.

period of study in a particular subject, especially at university

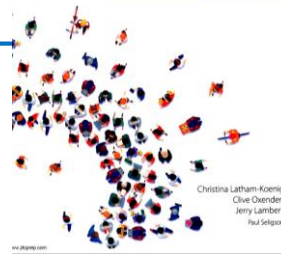
SYN program

E.g.: degree course in photography

14. Mime /maɪm/ (noun):

the use of movements to express what you want to say without using words, or a play where the actors use only movements

E.g.: They will perform a short mime later.



✓✓ **Unit 7C - Listening**

1. **Narrow** /'nærəʊ \$ -rəʊ/ (adjective):
 measuring only a small distance from one side to the other, especially in relation to the length OPP wide
E.g.: The stairs were very narrow.
2. **Fort** /fɔ:t \$ fɔ:rt/ (noun):
 a strong building or group of buildings used by soldiers or an army for defending an important place
E.g.: Just the three of you going to be holding the fort tonight.
3. **Desperate** /'despəret/ (adjective):
 willing to do anything to change a very bad situation, and not caring about danger
E.g.: I had no money left and was desperate.
4. **Dial** /daɪəl/ (verb):
 to press the buttons or turn the dial on a telephone in order to make a telephone call
E.g.: I think I dialed the wrong number.

1. **Pharmacist** /'fɑ:məsɪst \$ 'fɑ:r-/ (noun):
 someone whose job is to prepare medicines in a shop or hospital
E.g.: In New York, my pharmacist bills Medicaid directly.
2. **Symptom** /'sɪmptəm/ (noun):
 something wrong with your body or mind which shows that you have a particular illness
E.g.: Common symptoms of diabetes are weight loss and fatigue.
3. **Allergic** /ə'lɜ:dʒɪk \$ -ɜ:r-/ (adjective):
 having an allergy
E.g.: I'm allergic to penicillin.
